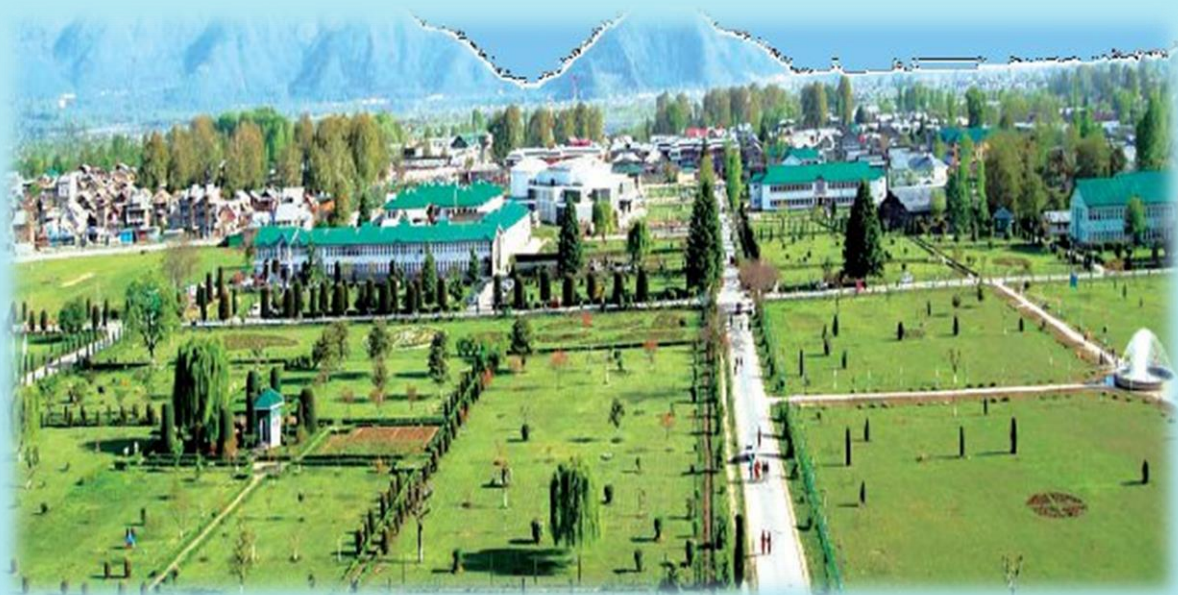

About the Conference

In recent years migration has taken on a new urgency. Migrant flows are increasing in volumes, and the composition of the migrants is becoming increasingly composite and complex. Migration is becoming increasingly political, influencing significant changes in how migrants are perceived and the conditions in which they live and work. The migration pathways are changing within the country and its effects are impacting states differently. For some states, migration has contributed and continues to contribute to important goals such as economic development, social dynamism, and cultural diversity. For others, the sense of urgency comes from questions on how to adjust to new migratory situations and develop effective policy responses to emerging challenges.

The global economic downturn has highlighted the vulnerability of migrants and their families as well as pointed to the importance of the preparedness of countries of origin to cope with the large-scale return of migrants, as a result of the crisis. Though the global

slowdown has reduced the migration flows, this can only be a temporary dip both in India as well as in the rest of the world. The evidence is mounting that increased cross-border movement will be the next frontier of globalization. All this taken together would suggest that our collective capacity to govern migration is not keeping pace with these developments. In this direction, the Department of Geography & Disaster Management, University of Kashmir, intends to hold One day National Conference on ***Changing Patterns of Migration: Challenges and Integration in the time of Crisis on October 5, 2021***. For the same, abstracts of original theoretical, conceptual, and empirical research relevant to the theme/ sub-themes of the conference are invited from academicians, research scholars, students, and other interested parties from universities, colleges, and other institutions to be submitted latest by ***September 28, 2021***.

- To identify factors affecting migration patterns in the time of crisis;
- To understand migration and its various manifestations to effectively address evolving migration dynamics;
- To understand factors underpinning migration, related to economic prosperity, inequality, demography, violence & conflict, pandemic, and environmental change;

- Font Size: 12
- Line spacing: 1.5
- Margins: 2.5 cm (1 inch)

A maximum of 5 keywords must be given.

Guidelines for Full Paper Submission

Manuscripts submitted to the National Conference on *Changing Patterns of Migration: Challenges and Integration in the time of crisis* should be the original work carried by the author(s) and should not have been previously presented or published elsewhere. A written declaration about the originality of the work from the Author(s) should be sent along with the paper in the prescribed format.

- Manuscripts should not exceed the word limit of 6000 words.
- All Manuscripts should be typed in MS Word format, using 12-point Times New Roman font with 1.5 line spacing and 1-inch margins.
- For referencing APA (American Psychological Association) style should be followed.

Paper Submission in Absentia

Authors, who cannot attend the conference in person, but wish to contribute a paper in absentia, are encouraged to e-mail their submissions. Such authors are requested to mail their submissions on migrationconference2@gmail.com. These submissions will go through the blind review process and the acceptance would be communicated to the corresponding author. Authors of papers in absentia must also complete the registration process as per guidelines.

Publication

All submissions will go through a blind review process and will be published in the form of an edited book with ISBN.
